- **PROJECT OF THE YEAR** J.W. Morgan Construction acquires 14 lots and starts construction on new homes in the Woodland Trails development in Owosso with assistance from the Shiawassee County Land Bank Authority and Michigan State Land Bank Authority, Shiawassee County Board of Commissioners and Brownfield Redevelopment Authority, Owosso City Council and Brownfield Redevelopment Authority, and Woodland Trails Condominium Association
- Structural steel provider Redinger Steel Erectors acquires 9,000 sq ft industrial facility and relocates to Perry Township bringing 15 new employees
- Site work construction business SF Construction purchasing land from City of Durand with plans to expand operations and add new industrial building space in Shiawassee County
- Owosso Speedway continues \$180M expansion in Middlebury Township on its path to becoming best short track in the United States
- Schlegel Sand & Gravel receives approval to start new sand mining operation in Woodhull Township
- Durand Meat Processing approved for \$365,000 grant from USDA Rural Development to increase and diversify production capacity at their facility in Vernon Township
- Indiana-based Acculevel Foundation Repair, a foundation repair and basement waterproofing company, secures acreage from City of Durand to build new Michigan headquarters with plans to invest nearly \$4 million and create 50 new jobs
- National Manufacturing Group implements quality training and certification in Owosso Charter Township through major grant from Global Epicenter of Mobility (GEM) initiative





Highlights Continued

- Allen Edwin Homes agrees to purchase 17 lots in the City of Durand for new homes, with the city, Shiawassee County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority and Shiawassee County Board of Commissioners approving a tax increment financing plan to support the development
- Six Shiawassee County small businesses secure over \$30,000 total in grant funding through the Eastern Michigan Small Business Network, including Campbell's Creekside Farms in Bennington Township, Dabble! Community Enrichment Center in Durand, Fitness Coliseum in Owosso, Fortitude in Bennington Township, Tank's Tavern in Laingsburg and The Blue Lotus Potter in Vernon
- Additional blight elimination projects completed through the Shiawassee County Land Bank Authority (with support from the Michigan State Land Bank Authority) including demolition of the former Welcome Inn property in Caledonia Charter Township and a building at 230 W Main St in the City of Durand
- Two downtown Owosso development projects (Curwood Place and Fountain Alley) receive nearly \$700,000 in grant support from the Michigan State Housing Development Authority for new housing

Financial Snapshot

SEDP maintains a strong financial position, with over 200 investors supporting the program and a strong trend of increasing operating income. The organization has used this growth to develop a 51% operating reserve to ensure its future resilience. In 2024, SEDP also received its 15th consecutive clean audit opinion one for each year of independent operation.

Moving into 2025, the SEDP now has an Investor Relations Manager onboard to help retain and grow our investor base.
